We now await with bated breath the results of these important deliberations that will shape the future of our Craft in California.

2025 Annual Communication Legislation

Voting Requirements: New legislation and Grand Master's Recommendations require a 5/6 vote (83.3%) to pass on first

presentation. Carryover legislation (items that received majority support but did not reach the 5/6 threshold) requires a 2/3 vote (66.7%) to pass. Grand Master's Decisions require only a simple majority as they are already in effect and voting codifies them into the California Masonic Code.

Grand Master's Decisions and Recommendations:

- **GM Decision No. 1:** Clarifies the esoteric or secret portion of the Ritual
- **GM Decision No. 2:** Installation of Lodge Officers Not Included in the Ritual
- **GM Recommendation No. 1:** Updates Grand Lodge Committee Membership, Duties, and Tenure
- **GM Recommendation No. 2:** Eliminates Code Provisions Relating to Officers Associations
- **GM Recommendation No. 3:** Centralized Notifications for Suspensions of Non-payment of Dues
- **GM Recommendation No. 4:** Updates the Duties of the Lodge Secretary
- **GM Recommendation No. 5:** Permits Charges to Be Withdrawn During Pre-trial Phase

2024 Carryover Legislation:

- **2024 GM Recommendation No. 4:** Updates required applicant contributions and contribution amounts (2024 Result: 74.53%)
- **2024 GM Recommendation No. 6:** Modifies lodge vote required to restore a Mason suspended for non-payment of dues (2024 Result: 83.15%)
- **2024 GM Recommendation No. 8:** Clarifies procedures to approve alternate rituals (2024 Result: 77.84%)
- **2024 GM Recommendation No. 11:** Permits a secretary to serve as master, warden, or secretary of another lodge (2024 Result: 74.14%)

- **2024 Resolution No. 24-01:** Makes third degree proficiency a prerequisite for nomination to the office of master, senior warden, or junior warden (2024 Result: 78.73%)

New Legislation for 2025:

- **Resolution 25-02:** Allows Cicero Research Lodge to Hold a Single Stated Meeting Annually
- **Resolution 25-04:** Changes the Offices of Grand Organist, Assistant Grand Organist, and Organist to Grand Musician, Assistant Grand Musician, and Musician

Brethren,

Masonic Development, Fellowship, & Charity. It's what we do.

We know **fellowship** is strong when we see our brothers choose to spend Super Bowl Sunday together. We were delighted to spend time dining with our ladies at the Sweethearts Night at the Sea Grill. At February's stated meeting we heard from our Inspector representing Most Worshipful Salazar who invites us to celebrate our commitment

to **charity** by participating in a statewide day of service March 17th followed by a Grand Lodge Festive Board on the 19th. Housekeeping – check.

Have you ever wondered what 'Our Ancient Landmarks you are carefully to preserve' means? I did a bit of poking around, and as with our craft there is a literal (operative) and a metaphorical (speculative) meaning. Reference to 'landmarks' goes back to Old Testament bible and refers to what today we would call surveyors' markings. In a modern context, the landmarks can be interpreted as a warning against disregarding the boundaries set by previous generations. In 1856, Bro. Albert Mackey wrote what he believed were 25 Ancient Landmarks. My favorite is 22, restated thus:

The Equality of all Masons is another Land-mark of the Order. This equality has no reference to any subversion of those gradations of rank which have been instituted by the usages of society. The monarch, the nobleman or the gentleman is entitled to all the influence, and receives all the respect which rightly belong to his exalted position. But the doctrine of Masonic equality implies that, as children of one great Father, ***we meet in the Lodge upon the level*** – that on that level we are all traveling to one predestined goal – that in the Lodge genuine merit shall receive more respect than boundless wealth, and that virtue and knowledge alone should be the basis of all Masonic honors, and be rewarded with preferment. When the labors of the Lodge are over, and the brethren have retired from their peaceful retreat, to mingle once more with the world, each will then again resume that social position, and exercise the privileges of that rank, to which the customs of society entitle him.

In the last century, several American Grand Lodges attempted to enumerate the landmarks, ranging from West Virginia (7) and

New Jersey (10) to Nevada (39) and Kentucky (54). While brothers may disagree on the speculative meaning of Landmarks I contend, nevertheless, that reading them and contemplating them ourselves is a worthwhile reflection.
